2023: Making Life Better Amid Challenges

Dear Community Members:

With great pride I highlight in this annual report the many ways the Champaign County Department of Job and Family Services (CCDJFS) team of dedicated public servants helped make life better for children, adults and seniors in 2023.

Through their resilience and outstanding performance, the CCDJFS team overcame a number of challenges. We entered the year with a staffing shortage and hefty workloads in all programs. This included having to redetermine eligibility of all Medicaid recipients, and disenrolling those no longer eligible. The federal government had put this process on hold since the beginning of the pandemic. Despite having to do more with less, our team pulled together and exceeded

expectations: Administration

- Hired and onboarded 14 new CCDJFS staff and two new Family and Children First Council staff
- Developed a strongly rooted culture within the agency based on 28 fundamentals that set us apart in our commitment to doing the right thing in our interactions with coworkers and the clients we serve
- Began developing an infrastructure for cross training and succession planning for our agency's key administrative positions

Child Support

- Collected \$5,607,439.91 in child support payments to help ensure children a better future
- Strengthened collection efforts by matching people delinquent in child support payments to their financial accounts, as well as developing procedures for credit/debit card payments
- Increased legal representation by hiring a full-time attorney

Public Assistance

- Continued to excel in timely benefit processing: Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), 100%; Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), 97%; and Medicaid, 96%
- Redetermined eligibility of 1,707 Medicaid cases, achieving a timeliness rate of 106%
- Processed a total of 2,710 intakes for SNAP, TANF, Medicaid and Long-Term Care
- Managed 392 benefit recovery claims, including 65 new referrals

Social Services

- Received support of 63% of county voters to renew the existing 2-mill children services levy
- Finalized three adoptions and placed one youth in adoptive placement with expected 2024 finalization
- Updated the County Abuse and Neglect Memorandum of Understanding, renewing our and our partners' shared mission to protect children from abuse/neglect; conduct

timely investigations to minimize further trauma to children; and coordinate prosecution and treatment of perpetrators

• Earned best practices funding (\$43,935), for the third year in a row, for timely completion of abuse/neglect investigations/assessments, at a rate of 95%, and completing and documenting required visits to families and children, at a rate of 96%

Workforce

- Developed the Graduate Success Program in partnership with the Madison-Champaign Educational Service Center to provide eligible high school youth interventions to prepare them for graduation and the workforce
- Increased participation by 24% in the Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program for young adults, age 14 to 24
- Provided more than \$834,594.40 in childcare assistance for an average of 235 children a month to help parents maintain employment

I look forward to what 2024 brings and am confident that my dedicated team will continue to excel in their service to the community.

Child Abuse Investigations and Assessments

CCDJFS Children Services staff, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, begin assessments or investigations upon receiving a report of suspected child abuse, neglect or dependency. A social service worker is available during regular business hours. After hours, an on-call social service worker can be reached through the Champaign County Dispatch Center.
